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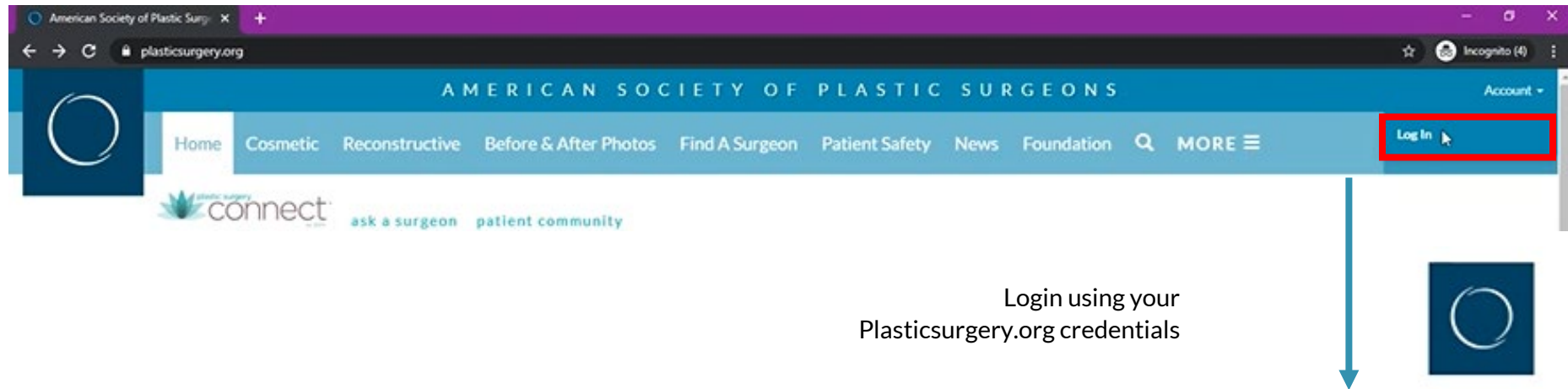
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Login to the REC

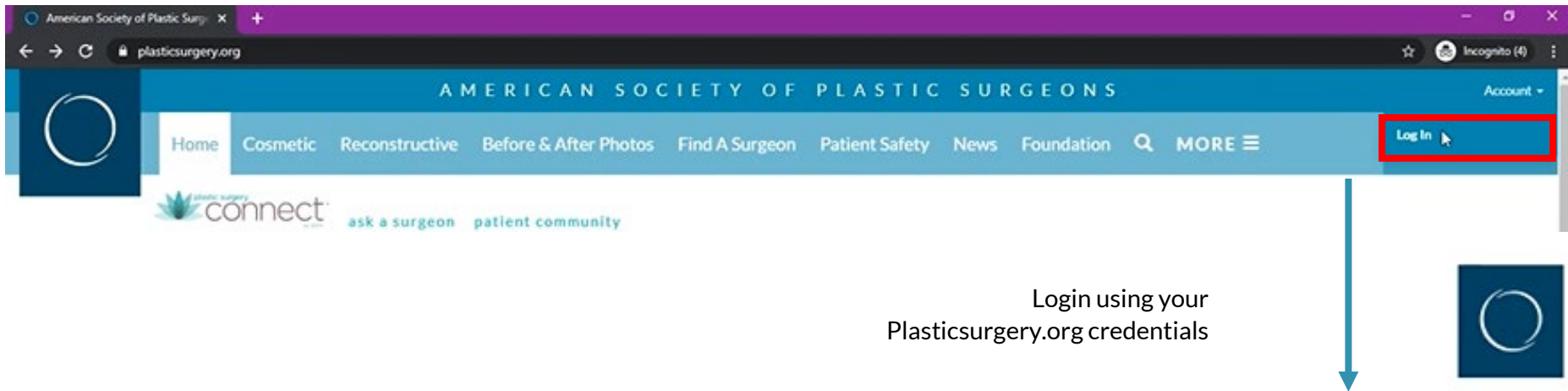
Once you are logged in your User Dashboard will appear. Select **Education** from the main tool bar.



On the Education page, select **Resident Education Center** under the Residents & Fellows Group.

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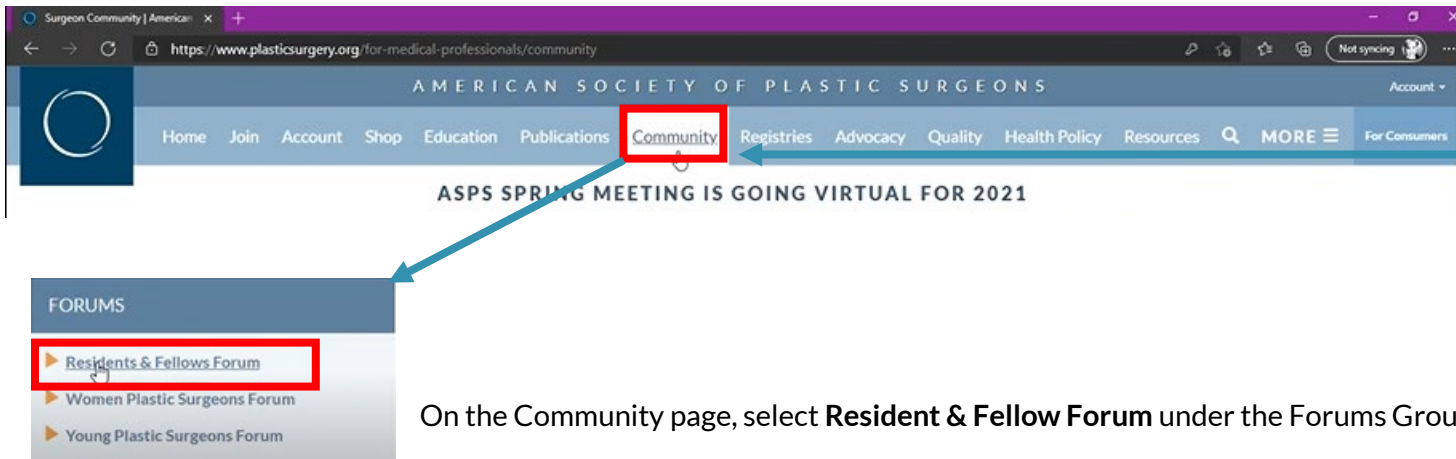

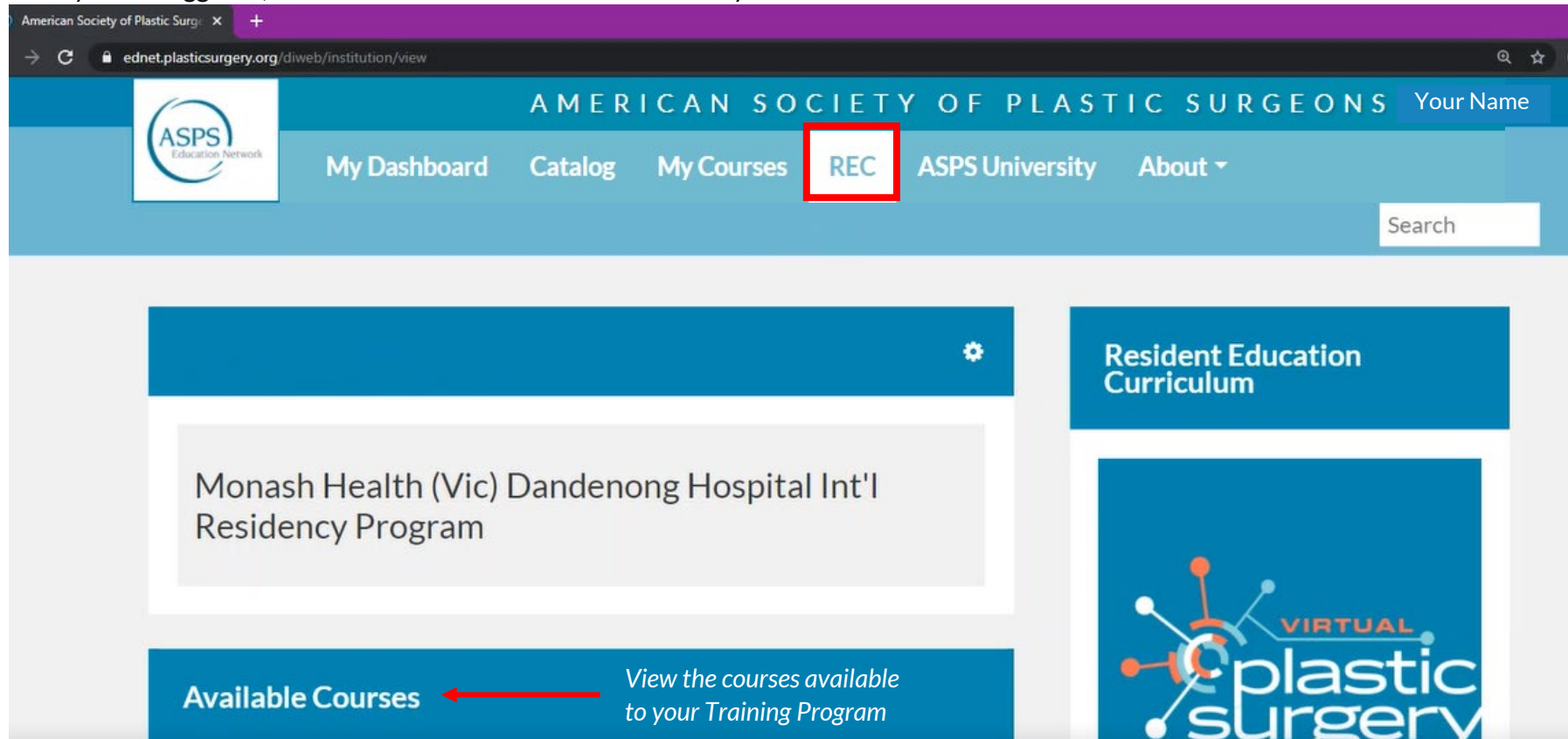

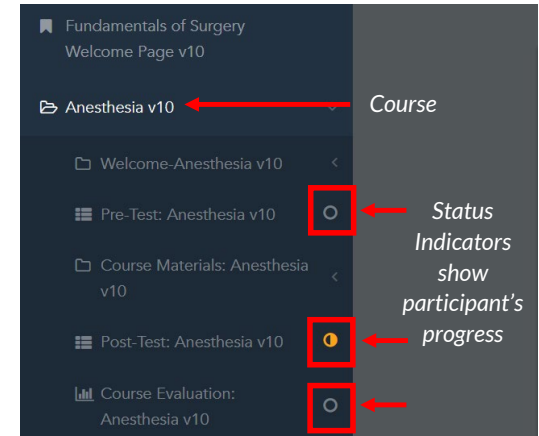
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Section Layout

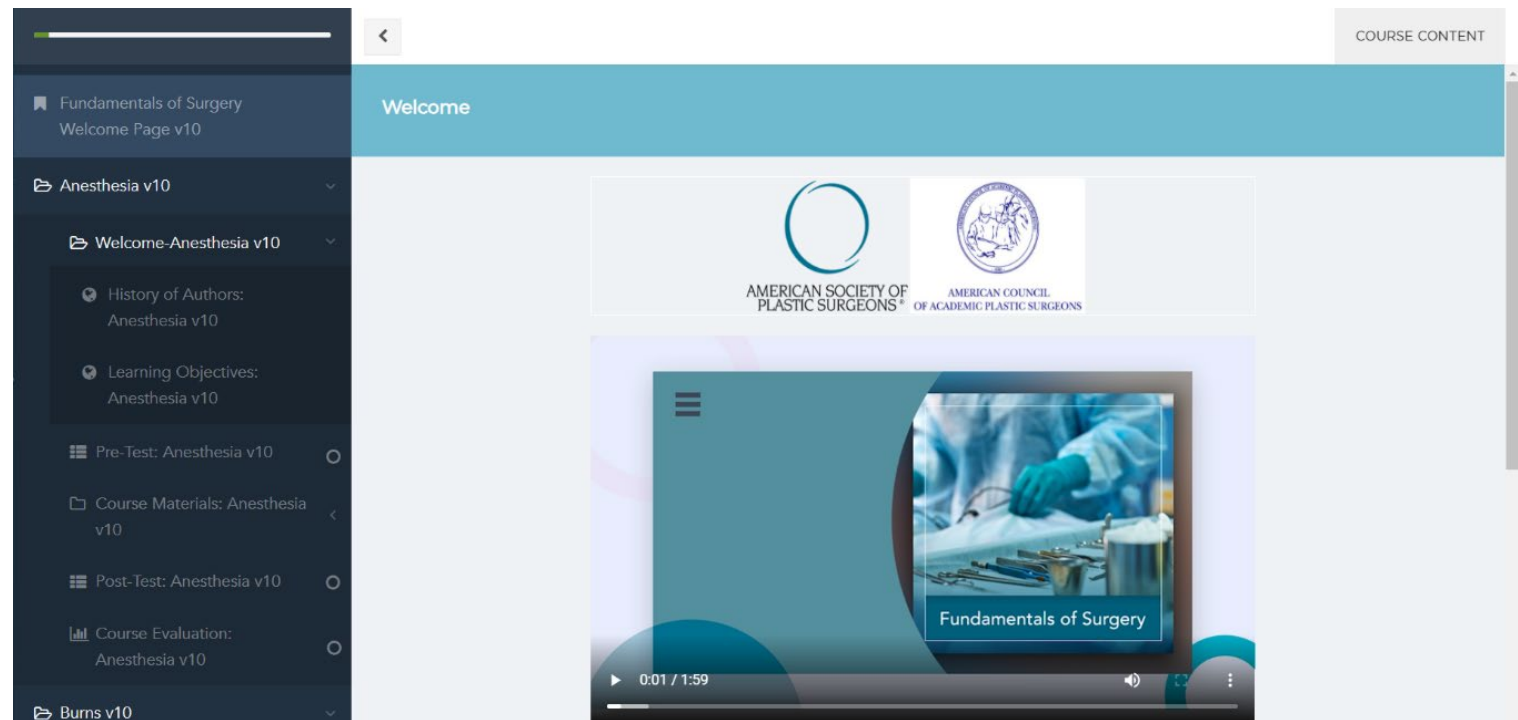

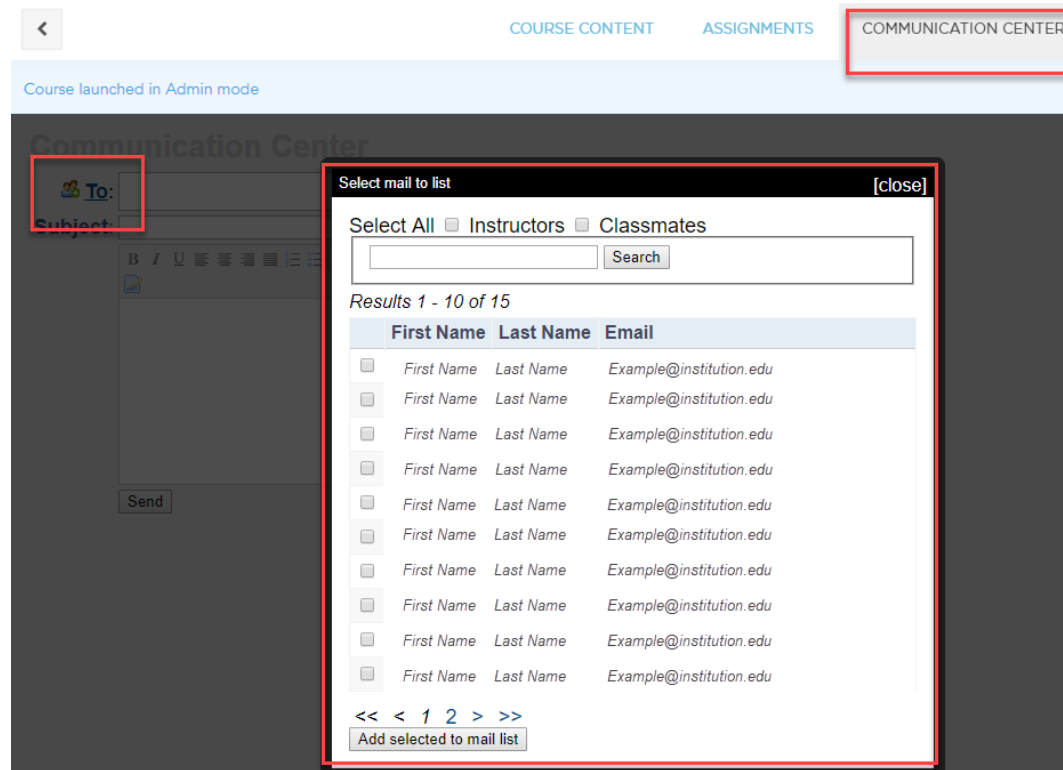
